

A NEW FEATURE.

The Chinamen in This City Will be Compelled to Have Their Pictures Taken.

—There is a new feature of the Chinese exclusion bill which will probably go a little harder with the Chinamen of this city than the other requirements of registration. Deputy United States revenue collectors will visit this city, the same as will be done all over the country, and will have charge of the registration and besides this will require every John here to have his picture taken. The picture must be a sun photograph and finished well, showing the facial features of the subject. Each picture must not be less than one and one-half inches in length from the top of the head to the chin. Besides furnishing his picture John will be compelled to give the color of his eyes, his complexion, height, weight, age, occupation, place of residence, the length of time he has resided in this city and state, and many other details of a personal nature.

There are quite a large number of Chinamen in this city and the deputies will no doubt experience considerable difficulty in obtaining exactly what they want. To John it will be something decidedly new, and he will no doubt object considerably until he becomes thoroughly impressed with the fact that if he doesn't comply with the requirements he will forfeit his residence in this country, which, it is needless to say, he is very desirous to retain. A PANTAGRAPHER engaged in conversation with one of the Mongolians in this city the other day and he, of course, knew absolutely nothing concerning the requirements of the bill lately passed. He knows nothing and cares less about anything except heaping up money, and the experience through which he will soon have to pass will cause him to jabber all day and night for a time, whereas he now jabbars only all day and and half of the night.
